It is understood that people want to be charitable, but this encourages vagrancy. Homeless people flock to the area and sleep here (in the Majik Forest) to pick up scraps on a Monday.

Please DO NOT PUT FOOD OUT, OR FEED PEOPLE WHO KNOCK ON DOORS.

This stance is endorsed by the City of Cape Town as it keeps the unfortunate in a cycle of dependence and promotes vagrancy.
